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Editorial

Some key changes to the political scene this month started off with Kemi Badenoch being elected as the new Leader of the Conservative Party and ended with the Government's Transport Secretary, Louise Haigh, resigning only a few days after she launched a new Jet Zero Taskforce comprising some of the most senior figures in the aviation sector with a core mission to revamp efforts to make greener air travel a reality!

The middle of the month (14th) saw an adjournment debate on the impact of aircraft noise in communities – the debate was initiated by Sarah Olney (Richmond Park) MP and mainly centred around Heathrow. Parliamentary questions on noise around Gatwick airport, (along with its general expansion), were also raised by Mike Martin MP (Tunbridge Wells). Noise, of course, remains one of the biggest aviation issues of concern for SASIG members and is often raised at our meetings and brought before industry policy makers and politicians.

The Prime Minister was also urged by Gatwick, not to let a decision on their second runway 'fester'. Bosses say any delay would push up cost of the £2.2bn project and stop airlines from adding new routes. Meanwhile, Heathrow's incoming main shareholder has laid out support for expansion as they believe the airport needs to grow in the coming years.

There were plenty of other interesting developments elsewhere in the sector during the month. On 4 November, the High Court of the Rol agreed to pause the effects of the Dublin Airport passenger cap that was due to affect airlines' access to take-off and landing slots over summer 2025 period. Dublin is proving a very interesting case study in the application of land use and noise policy at a congested airport and there is clearly more to come as that story develops.

Also early in the month, it was reported that a bidder to reopen/run Doncaster Sheffield Airport, had been identified and then mid-month, it was announced that AGS who own Aberdeen, Glasgow and Southampton airports, had been sold in a £1.53bn deal. London City, Bristol and Birmingham airports are all also, reportedly for sale.

And finally, this month saw the CAA publish its final report into the NATS ATC failure of 28 August last year and also launch their new drone policy.

CAA consultation: Aviation Environmental Review

1 October 2024: Following publication of the first UK Aviation Environmental Review (AER) in December 2023, the CAA published a <u>consultation</u> seeking views from all interested parties on the future development of the AER. The CAA aim to develop the AER into a tool that can be used by Government, industry and other interested stakeholders to inform and drive positive environmental change. To ensure the AER develops into a useful tool for stakeholders, this consultation seeks feedback on the CAA's overall ambition for the AER, alongside input on the nature of environmental data reported, including how this data should be presented.

This consultation closes on 10 December 2024.

Govt consultation: UK Airspace Design Service (UKADS).

22nd October 2024: <u>This consultation</u> proposes creating a single guiding mind responsible for future airspace design – a UK Airspace Design Service (UKADS) – to deliver modernisation at

scale and at pace, as envisaged by the CAA's Airspace Modernisation Strategy published in January 2023.

This joint consultation by the DfT and CAA, as co-sponsors of airspace modernisation, seeks views on what the UKADS could do and how they might set it up.

This consultation will run until 17 December 2024.

5 November: Flight cancellations

An urgent question was asked by Jim Shannon (Strangford): "To ask the Secretary of State for Transport if she will make a statement on the ongoing connectivity issues caused by belatedly announced cancellations of flights, such as those between Belfast and London". The ensuing debate may be <u>seen here</u>.

14 November – Aircraft Noise: Local Communities

14 November - NATS Technical Failure: CAA Report

The Transport Secretary, Louise Haigh MP, informed the House of the CAA's publication today of the final report of the independent review, led by Jeff Halliwell and an expert panel, into the NATS technical IT failure of 28 August 2023. See the statement here.

19 November – Aviation (Accessibility)

Daniel Francis (Bexleyheath & Crayford) begged to move that leave be given to bring in a Bill to make provision about the accessibility of air travel for disabled passengers; to make provision about the powers of the Civil Aviation Authority to enforce accessibility

requirements; to remove the limit on compensation for damage to wheelchairs or other mobility equipment on domestic flights; and for connected purposes. His motion is here.

Transport Questions: House of Lords

The House rose on 6th for the Autumn Recess and returned on 11 November.

5 November: Renewable Transport Fuel Obligations (Sustainable Aviation Fuel) Order 2024

Lord Hendy of Richmond Hill asked that the Grand Committee to consider the Renewable Transport Fuel Obligations (Sustainable Aviation Fuel) Order 2024. Details are here. On 6

November he asked that the draft Order and Regulations laid before the House on 24 July and 9 September be approved. Relevant document: 1st and 3rd Reports from the Secondary Legislation Scrutiny Committee (special attention drawn to the second instrument).

Q.1. Question (HL2513) asked by Baroness Randerson on 13 November 2024: "To ask His Majesty's Government whether they plan to implement financial mechanisms to support sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) production in the UK in view of the forthcoming SAF mandate.".

A. Lord Hendy on 27 November 2024: "As announced in the King's Speech, the Government will be laying legislation to introduce a revenue certainty mechanism that will support SAF production in the UK. We expect the legislation for a revenue certainty mechanism to be in place by the end of 2026. We also announced in the Budget that we will extend the Advanced Fuels Fund for a year to support the development of SAF plants in the UK".

Q.2. Question (HL2330) asked by Baroness Ritchie of Downpatrick on 5 November 2024: "To ask His Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of ongoing air connectivity between Belfast and London".

A. Lord Hendy of Richmond Hill on 15 November 2024: "We recognise the importance of maintaining a thriving and competitive aviation sector in the UK that supports and strengthens Union connectivity. Passengers between Belfast and London are well served with a choice of between 22 and 35 flights per day, depending on the season, between Belfast's two airports (Belfast City and Belfast International) and five London airports (Gatwick, Heathrow, City, Luton and Stansted)".

Q.3. Question (HL2551) asked by Baroness Hoey on 14 November 2024: "To ask His Majesty's Government what plans they have to create designated-British-passports-only entry points at UK airports".

A. Lord Hanson of Flint on 28 November 2024: "Whilst there are currently no plans to change queuing arrangements at the UK Border, those arrangements remain under constant review in order to prioritise security, maintain fluidity and ensure that we continue to run our border in the UK's best interests. As the quickest and most efficient method of crossing the border, we encourage all eligible passengers to make use of the e-Gates at our ports of entry where possible".

Q.4. Question (14168) asked by Chris Hinchliff (North-East Herts) on 13 November 2024: "To ask the Secretary of State for Transport, what assessment her Department has made of the potential economic impact of differences in the cost per mile of domestic (a) plane and (b) train travel; and if her Department will make an assessment of the potential merits of taking steps to equalise costs to ensure it is never cheaper to travel by plane than train for domestic purposes".

A. Mike Kane on 19 November 2024: "The UK aviation market operates predominantly in the private sector. Airlines' business models can at times accommodate more flexible pricing than the railway. The Government sets the percentage that regulated rail fares can be increased each year. Regulated fares make up around 45 per cent of rail fares and include commuter fares, such as season ticket and shorter-distance peak return, alongside longer-distance off-peak returns. The increase in regulated fares for 2025 will be the lowest absolute increase in three years and delivers a fair balance between passengers and taxpayers".

Q.5. Question (15350) asked by Mike Martin (Tunbridge Wells) on 20 November 2024: "To ask the Secretary of State for Transport, what discussions she has had with the Civil Aviation Authority on steps to ensure that airspace modernisation around Gatwick airport leads to a reduction in noise levels for residents".

A. Mike Kane on 28 November 2024: "The department has regular engagement with the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) to monitor the effective delivery of airspace modernisation and drive forward the environmental benefits of the programme. In its role as independent regulator, the CAA ensures that all airspace change proposals (ACPs) adhere to the CAP1616 process. CAP1616 sets out how sponsors of airspace change, such as Gatwick Airport, must consider the impacts of noise on the local communities, ensuring sufficient consultation takes place with those potentially affected".

Q.6. Question (15348) asked by Mike Martin (Tunbridge Wells) on 20 November 2024: "To ask the Secretary of State for Transport, what assessment she has made of the potential impact of night-time flight noise on the health of residents living in Gatwick airport's flight path".

A. Mike Kane on 28 November 2024: "The Government sets noise-related restrictions at Gatwick, including a limit on the number of night flights. The noise impacts of the airport are assessed annually. The Department for Transport has commissioned the Aviation Night Noise Effects study to explore how annoyance and sleep disturbance impacts vary at different times of the night. The final results are expected to be published in Autumn 2026".

Q.7. Question (15026) asked by Adam Jogee (Newcastle-under-Lyme) on 19 November 2024: "To ask the Secretary of State for Transport, if she will have discussions with representatives from Manchester Airport on the potential impact of the level of parking charges at Manchester Airport on passengers from (a) Newcastle-under-Lyme constituency and (b) North Staffordshire".

A. Mike Kane on 27 November 2024: "Most airports in the UK are managed and operated as private businesses, and parking arrangements are subject to contractual agreements between airport operators and car parking companies covered by consumer laws. Whilst the Department does engage regularly with airports on a range of operational issues, the provision and charging of car parking at airports is a matter for the airport operator as a commercial business to manage and justify".

Q.8. Question (15981) asked by Mike Martin (Tunbridge Wells) on 25 November 2024: "To ask the Secretary of State for Transport, how many times she has met with representatives of Gatwick Airport to discuss the proposed expansion".

A. Mike Kane on 3 December 2024: "The Secretary of State for Transport has not met with representatives of Gatwick Airport to discuss the proposed expansion at the airport".

Q.9. Question (15980) asked by Mike Martin (Tunbridge Wells) on 25 November 2024: "To ask the Secretary of State for Transport, what recent discussions she has had with campaign groups opposing the expansion of Gatwick airport".

A. Mike Kane on 2 December 2024: "The Secretary of State for Transport has had no discussions with campaign groups opposing the expansion of Gatwick Airport".

Q.10. Question (15979) asked by Mike Martin (Tunbridge Wells) on 25 November 2024: "To ask the Secretary of State for Transport, what assessment she has made of the potential impact on public safety of proposals to expand use of the emergency runway at Gatwick airport for commercial flights".

A. Mike Kane on 3 December 2024: "A proposal to expand use of the northern runway at Gatwick Airport is currently subject to a live application for a Development Consent Order, which will be determined by my Department. It would therefore not be appropriate for me to comment but all relevant matters, including safety and noise, will be thoroughly considered before a decision is issued, the statutory deadline for which is 27 February 2025".
